Prairie unleashed a tenacious defense in the second quarter when it outscored Dubuque Hempstead by 15 points and sprinted past the Mustangs, 66-48, Tuesday night in a girls basketball game at Prairie.

The fourth starter in double figures was Alisa Weiland, who complemented the Hawks' fast-break offense from the perimeter, knocking down 12 points.

"We just have a nice group of young players that are extremely competitive, work hard to get better, and want to do well together," said Prairie Coach Steve Doser. "They just enjoy the game, enjoy each other, and the chemistry is amazing."
