VanDraska thinks his team is peaking at just the right time to make a run for the state title.

"Most definitely," he said. "We've got guys who are all cutting down times. We're just doing great. And I think we're going to be ready next week.

"It's going to take perfection," VanDraska said. "And at this point I think we can be perfect on that day."

VanDraska is ranked No. 2 in Class 4A and Ryan Schweizer of Dowling is ranked No. 1. They could end up battling for top individual honors in Fort Dodge.

Schweizer finished second at the 2014 state meet and VanDraska was seventh.

"He's a great runner," VanDraska said. "I knew he'd be at the top all year. So I've been training with him in mind and I'm going to go for it all.



"I'm a kicker and so is he," VanDraska said. "It's doing everything I can to have the edge on him right at the end of the line."
