

Snitker wins Metro Spotlight Award

Cedar Rapids Washington quarterback Reid Snitker is this week's winner of the Metro Spotlight Award for high school boys, the Metro Sports Report announced Sunday.

Snitker threw two touchdown passes in the final 61 seconds last Thursday night as the Warriors rallied from a 27-15 deficit to stun Waterloo West, 28-27, at Kingston Stadium.

Snitker, a junior, completed 22 of 31 passes for 222 yards. Both of his TD passes were to Isaiah Nimmers, including the game-winner with 15.5 seconds remaining.

Snitker has completed 59.6 percent of his passes (59 for 99) for 614 yards and five touchdowns for the Warriors (2-3). Washington visits top-ranked Xavier this Friday night.
