Ball helped the 12th-ranked Kohawks achieve a 29-9 win over Augustana Friday night by defeating Thomas Reyhons, 12-3, at 174 pounds.

"I'd like to be an All-American champion rather than have 100 wins," he said. "I could go in with 50 wins and like I said that'd be more important."

His attitude toward this current success is helping him in practice, according to Oostendorp. "He's very grounded and he's had success but I know he wants to finish it out right, and he's doing everything correctly in the room right now and it's going to carry over, I believe."

Ball's goals extend to the rest of his team as well, trying to get the Kohawks (9-3) back to a top-five team again. Oostendorp added, "I think the importance of wrestling to him really shows the other kids the level of commitment it takes to have success at this level."

Ball spoke about his choice to commit to Oostendorp and his college wrestling career. "Coach O, you'd run through a wall for that guy because you know he'd run through a wall for you," he said. "It's been a good ride."
