There is no question this team receives many raves due to the exemplary play of Paige, but Robertson said other players are starting to find their groove.

"We hope to get even more great play from Derik Gogg on the inside and if we can continue to have two or three players stepping it up along with Marcus, we will continue to play well and have good results."
